

Advent One "Hope": Nov 29: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism. God's people keep vigil as we wait for Christ's coming (advent). God promises justice, righteousness and peace. We promise to repent, change, be healed and transformed.

Advent Two "Peace": Dec 6 Communion and Reception of New Members: Who is crying in the wilderness today? Is God messaging us? What's keeping us from hearing? We welcome all to share communion irrespective of your denomination or age. If you love the Lord Jesus, come, eat, drink and remember.


Advent Three "Joy": Dec 13 Church School and Youth Programme "Back in time": is the working title of this year's Christmas Pageant. Experience the joy of Christmas as seen through the eyes of our younger friends. Children especially will enjoy seeing the story of Christmas told by their peers and classmates. A special visitor is expected to join us following lunch. Everyone is welcome.

Advent Four "Love": Dec 20 Christmas Sunday: Service of Lessons and Carols: The Choir presents "Midnight Clear" – the Christmas Story in Word and Song: Traditions predominate as we hear the scriptures read and sing the favourite carols of the season. Students and other family from out of town may be "home for the holidays". Make this Sunday a time for the entire family to get together.

Ecumenical Longest Night Service: Dec 21 at 7:00 p.m. at R.H. United Church: Experience the peace that comes from stillness and silence after the hectic rush of preparations. This service can be a time of remembering for folk who have experienced a bereavement, break-up or lost a job this year. Even though you may not feel jolly or merry allow music, word and liturgy to comfort you and surround you with God's love. The ministers of our community churches come together to lead this special service.

Christmas Eve Service of Carols and Communion: Dec 24 at 7:30 p.m. Tonight we light the Christ Candle and meditate together on how the world is different because Jesus is both a mirror to humanity and a window to divinity. Candles will illuminate the chancel as glowing faces reflect God's love come down at Christmas. Carols and Communion allow God to draw close to us on the Holy Night.
